

INTRA-PROVINCIAL APPORTIONMENT GUIDELINES : KWAZULU NATAL

Attached are the revised KZN Apportionment Guidelines for the new conveyancing and notarial fee structures which came into effect on the 1st March 2013.

These Intra-Provincial Apportionment Guidelines apply only between attorneys, conveyancers and notaries public who practice in the Province of Kwazulu Natal, and who instruct Pietermaritzburg correspondents to lodge and register deeds on their behalf in the Pietermaritzburg Deeds Registry.

The attention of Members is drawn to **paragraph A 1. (3)** on page 1 of the attached guidelines which makes it clear that the fees which are payable to Pietermaritzburg correspondents for the lodgement / registration of deeds are payable **out of the total recommended fees and are not to be added to the total recommended fee.**

These Intra-Provincial Apportionment Guidelines come into effect in respect of all transactions where the instructing attorney, conveyancer or notary public is instructed on or after the 1st March 2013 and have been settled at a meeting of conveyancers arranged by the KZN Law Society Property Law Committee and which represented conveyancers from Pietermaritzburg, from areas outside of Pietermaritzburg including representation by NADEL and the BLA.
